Board Development Programme

IN-BOARD is a programme was primarily designed by INSEAD and our Alumni. The programme trains prospective candidates to become effective Non-Exec Directors, with the associated goal of providing a better exchange of Non Executive Directors for medium sized-companies and family firms.

The IN-BOARD initiative consists of a local workshop series in each host country, in tandem with a "Leadership Workshop" on the Fontainebleau campus in November each year. Current sponsors include Freshfields, KPMG, Korn Ferry and Alix Partners.

The programme was pioneered in the Netherlands, and is currently also offered in Germany. There is growing interest in offering a local Swiss programme.

Excellence, and is there a future for 3 Michelin Stars?

For an exceptional chef who has maintained 3 Michelin stars at the Waterside Inn for over 25 years, this might seem at first as an unusual title for his keynote speech at our 2011 AGM. Yet after 45 minutes of hearing Michel Roux speak, with his usual passion, feeling and understanding of all that is good in the culinary world, it was clear to all that he was right to ask the question. With a professional experience spanning nearly six decades, he has seen many changes and much evolution in this highly challenging world of top level gastronomy.

He explained to the benefit of many the subtle differences in one, two and three stars, and the massive investment needed to move from one level to the next. For instance, whilst the difference in dishes served between a two star and three star restaurant may be comparatively small to the inexperienced diner, the degree of input in its elaboration is nearly double, as reflected by the number of kitchen staff. And

yet, as one remarked, if the prices are not double, which they rarely are, what incentive

would there be for a two star chef to seek that third star? That, replied Michel Roux, is because the three star chef also earns more through his external contracts, as consultant and publisher of books and videos, than would a two star chef: such is the prize of celebrity.

However, the point Michel Roux sought to make was whereas for the three star chefs of old, who strove for a lifetime to reach the summit of their craft, the new generation have a much shorter time frame. It used to be that top chefs emanated not from restaurants, but from the "grandes familles", whose stringent re-

quirements and social engagements made those chefs be most creative and push themselves to the highest limits, where excellence was achieved daily in comparative anonymity. In the sixties, nearly two thousand top level chefs excelled in their craft in stately homes around France.

And what of excellence? That, he said, is not a simple matter of judgment!

Today that number has reduced to fewer than one hundred.

And what of excellence? That, he said, is not a simple matter of judgment.

It is more than the best one can achieve, it is the constant belief that one can and always should strive to achieve it. To accept second best, or mediocrity, is to fail in excellence. For all of us in the room, who were all charmed, entertained and enlightened, there was no question in which camp he belonged.

INSEAD helped create the Cartier Women's Initiative Awards, an international business plan competition for women entrepreneurs.

Since its inception five years ago, it has provided support, visibility and coaching to 76 women heading businesses in countries across the globe. INSEAD provides business coaching to Laureates.
